

WFMC Worship Service Cohort Form

During the Covid pandemic, the terms cohort, extended family, or bubble have been used to describe a select group of people that you choose to share non-socially distanced activities with. A cohort agrees to limit their close-contact church activities to those within the group so as to limit exposure and transmission risk should exposure to Covid occur. The leadership team has decided to implement a cohort registration system for our weekly worship services to provide people the opportunity to sit near and fellowship more closely with people who are in their bubble.

Requirements for creating a cohort:

- All adults/guardians of each household are required to sign the WFMC cohort form
- A maximum of 5 households will be allowed in a single cohort
- You may not join more than one cohort at a time
- You must remain in your cohort for at least 3 months before changing to a new one
- Your cohort must choose either the Saturday evening or Sunday morning service time

By joining a cohort you agree to:

- Accept the increased risk that comes with 'close contact' social activities.
- Accept the increased requirements of extra quarantine time and mandatory testing if someone tests positive within your cohort group.
- Protect your cohort by limiting your Covid exposure to those within your social bubble
- Protect your cohort by not attending church if you:
 - Have any of the self-assessment symptoms as outlined by the government of SK
 - Have been outside the province within the past 14 days
- Inform your cohort members if you become symptomatic or require testing
- Not introduce new people into the cohort without the permission of the entire group
- Sit in the assigned seating areas for your cohort group

Frequently Asked Questions:

- What should I do if I want to change cohorts? – You must have been in your current cohort for at least 3 months, then you must submit a newly completed and signed “WFMC Cohort Form” with your new cohort members to the church office.
- What if my parents come to visit, can they sit with my cohort? – No, your parents must sit in a socially distanced seat not within your cohort (you are welcome to go sit with them if you would like).
- How many people can be in our cohort? – Up to five households. This means that some cohorts will be larger than others due to the size of the member’s households.
- How will I know where our cohort is sitting? – The ushers will have a diagram of all the assigned cohort seating for that Sunday. They will show you where to sit.
- Does our cohort all have to attend the same service? – Yes, you will need to choose either the Saturday evening or Sunday morning service. This helps with the assignment of seating and logistics of planning the sanctuary seating map.
- Can I go to a different service than my cohort? Sure, you will need to sit in a socially distanced spot.
